Singapore Art Week



Art Stage Singapore, opens its doors next week for its fifth edition launching the city's Art Week.

From the very beginning the fair has created a strong network of interesting and amusing events that are held in town throughout its duration. My Art Guides have selected a short number of exhibitions not to be missed.

"20 + 2" is the title of the exhibition celebrating the 20th anniversary of ARNDT Berlin and the second anniversary of the gallery in Singapore, a substantial presentation of 50 artworks by 39 artists from Central and Southeast-Asia, the United States, Germany, Europe, Russia and Australia marks the commitment of its founder Matthias Arndt to the new gallery in Singapore.

Among the many interesting shows which will take place in the iconic Gillman Barracks, the art cluster located on the site of a former military camp, Ivory Black will be on display at ShangART the show is dedicated to the widely acclaimed Chinese contemporary artist Ding Yi. In his recent works he explores the existence of unforeseen natural phenomena, and his works changed from expanding vibrant color to reserved dark color.

The not for profit venue Spacecottonseed is showcasing <u>Writing an Image</u>, a group exhibition of five artists, Farid Stevy Asta, Wisnu Auri, Indra Dodi, Youn-seuk Oh and Seungho Yoo, who have been practicing art in relation to text and writing.

A unique exhibition by Michel Platic, <u>After</u>, will be on display at Art Plural featuring dramatic living paintings presented form of video installations and large-scale prints.

To be mentioned, a couple of unmissable events promoted by international brands with a long term history as patrons of the arts: Hermes' Third Floor space hosts and exhibition by Ran Hwang, Becoming Again which transforms the venue into a private garden, in a tribute to the infinite cycle of nature. Rolls-Royce showroom will showcase an installation by Carlos Rolón/Dzine to be unveiled for the first time during the Art Week.
